A PROCLAMATION. By Isaac H. Williamson, Governor of the State of New-Jersey.

WHEREAS a vacancy has happened in the representation of this State, in the House of Representatives in the 16th Congress of the United States, by the resignation of John Condit, Esq.

It is therefore ordered, that all persons interested in the lands, tenements, hereditaments and real estates of said decedents do appear before the judges of this court on the first day of February Term next, and show cause if they have why the whole of the real estates of said decedents should not be sold to satisfy the debts and expenses which remain unpaid.
